Recycling Programs

Waste Management encourages residents to take advantage of the following drop-off recycling programs for FREE during normal business hours.

Please bring proof of residency, such as a valid driver's license or billing statement with current address.

- One (1) bulky item (e.g. sofa, washer, heater, etc)
- Tires—up to four (4) waste tires per year (no commercial tires accepted)
- Free Residential Disposal Day— residents can bring up to one (1) ton of materials twice per year to the Lancaster Landfill on Saturday, April 8 and Saturday, October 14, 2017
- Mattress Recycling Program—residents can bring in mattresses for free. No mixed trash or recyclables can be accepted in the load
- TV's and computer monitors are accepted for free.



Working Together to Keeping our Deserts Clean

Illegal dumping is a serious issue and Waste Management (WM) has been a long time community advocate and member of the Illegal Dumping Task Force since its inception in 1996.

We work closely with the County of Los Angeles, Board of Supervisor's office, City of Lancaster, City of Palmdale, Town Councils and non-profit organizations to help keep our deserts clean.

WM contributes \$25,000 on an annual basis to the Antelope Valley Illegal Dumping Task Force to develop prevention programs and assist with illegal dumping efforts.

What's New at the Lancaster Landfill?

Meet Tiggs, our newest team member!



The Lancaster Landfill recently introduced an innovative bird abatement program to effectively scare off scavenger birds; such as seagulls, which has been an issue at landfills across the country for years.

Traditional methods use mechanical bird noise makers, imitation owls, and other solutions.

Seagulls interfere with the landfill operations, roost on nearby buildings, contaminate our local water resources, and become a nuisance in and around the surrounding neighborhoods. The gulls persistently scav-

enge for food and the landfill is a prime location to catch a bite to eat.

Hawks and falcons have long been used as deterrents at airports, schools, and vineyards. These birds are trained not to prey on other vectors or even go near the gulls. In fact, seagulls react instinc-

tively to their presence and disperse immediately. We refer to falcons as the shark in the sky, "everyone runs when you see one."

Featured above is Tiggs, a Harris hawk, who is on site two to three times a week to help keep the landfill operations free of the feathery pests. Through positive reinforcement, Tiggs is trained to fly back to their owner and rewarded with a food treat for a job well done. His favorite food to eat are rabbits and mice.
