- Labor Day, Monday September 7, 2015

Waste Management will collect and recycle Holiday trees for the first 2 weeks following the Christmas holiday on your regular collection day.

- Trees taller than six feet must be cut in half.
- Remove all decorations including tinsel, lights, ornaments, tree stands.
- Flocked trees will be collected but cannot be recycled.

For multi-family dwellings, trees should be stacked in one convenient location. Check with your landlord or property manager for designated location.
