Food Waste Recycling Added Encouraging Event Goers to Help Make July 4 2014 The Greenest Ever

MISSION VIEJO, CALIF. – July 1, 2014 - The City of Mission Viejo and Waste Management announced today the addition of food waste recycling at Mission Viejo's Annual Fourth of July Street Faire and Fireworks Spectacular this July 4, in an effort to encourage recycling practices. The patriotic festival, which is organized by the Mission Viejo Activities Committee starts at 12:00 p.m. on Olympia Road between Marguerite Parkway and Melinda Road.

Nearly 20,000 event goers are encouraged to recycle their food leftovers by placing them inside specially marked Waste Management food waste collection carts that will be located near the food stands.
