### **Lawn Mower Trade in Program**

Waste Management is proud to announce the Lawn Mower Trade in Program is back! Thanks to its renewed partnership with the Ventura County Air Pollution Control District (APCD), Ventura County residents can turn in their working, gas powered lawnmower to the Simi Valley Landfill and Recycling Center for free and receive a \$200 voucher from the Air Pollution Control District to purchase a new cordless electric mower. These savings amount to up to 50% off a new, electric lawn mower!



"This is a great opportunity for Ventura County residents to make a green difference in their community. Trading in your gas-powered lawn mowers can dramatically help to reduce carbon emissions around your home and in your neighborhood," said Stan Cowen, Ventura County Air Pollution Control District representative.

All mowers must be drained of any oil and gasoline; be sure to participate in local household hazardous waste events to properly dispose of these fluids.
