The Planning Commission will review and proceed to take a position on the final Environmental Impact Report(EIR).

The project provides many benefits to the community:

- Establishes one of the first green building LEED facilities at a landfill in the county by using recycled and sustainable building materials, energy-efficient lighting, green energy programs and recycled water
- Provides charitable contributions including annual sponsorships, service donations and employee volunteer support

Waste Management’s Modernization and Expansion project for the Simi Valley Landfill and Recycling Center includes many benefits to the community, including expanding recycling capabilities and creating open space for wildlife habitat conservation.

The Simi Landfill and Recycling Center alone powers the equivalent of 2,500 homes each day with two landfill gas-to-energy generators using methane gas.

Waste Management maintains 230 good paying jobs in Ventura County and injects more than \$48 million annually into the County economy. The modernization and expansion of the landfill will create much needed additional jobs, including 100 construction jobs over four years and 150 new permanent good paying jobs, with benefits, for decades to come.
