Tips for Setting Out Extra Materials After a Weather Delay

Extra garbage

Place next to garbage container in securely tied plastic bags labeled "Garbage" or 32-gallon lidded can (65 lb limit) labeled "Garbage."

Extra recycling

Place next to the recycling cart in any of the following:

- Plastic recycling bins
- Kraft bags, cardboard boxes or 32-gallon containers with handles and lid. Please label "Recycle"

Please, no recycling in plastic bags

Extra yard debris (No food scraps or plastic)

Place next to food scraps/yard debris cart in any of the following:

- Heavy brown paper yard bags (available at hardware stores)
- 32-gallon cans with handles & lids (65 lb limit) labeled "Yard Waste"
- Bundles tied with natural twine (4'x2' limit)

Properly disposing of waste protects public health and the environment.
