Spring is off to a fantastic start here in New Boston, and I'm excited to share some good news from both our landfill operations and community programs. Thanks to a stretch of dry weather and our active partnerships with the community, we've seen great progress and productivity across the board.

The New Boston Landfill is running smoothly, with daily operations benefiting from the dry conditions. Our recycling drop-off continues to be well-utilized, though we do see occasional contamination. As a friendly reminder, please recycle only bottles, cans, paper, and cardboard. If you're unsure whether an item belongs in the recycling bin, it's best not to include it.

Looking ahead, construction on a new landfill cell is scheduled to get underway late next month or in early June. Excavation will continue through August and September, supporting our commitment to long-term capacity and environmental stewardship.
