ACCEPTABLE ITEMS:

Acids; Aluminum; Antifreeze; Batteries; Brake & Transmission Fluid; Cleaning Products; Lawn & Garden Chemicals; Lighter Fluid; Paints, Solvents & Varnish; Pesticides & Herbicides

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS:

Agricultural Chemicals; Ammunition; Asbestos-containing Materials; Compressed Gases; Containers Larger Than 5 Gallons; Dioxins; Explosives & Fireworks; Industrial, Commercial or Business Waste; Medical & Pharmaceutical Items; Propane Cylinders; Radioactive Materials; Tires

PLEASE REMEMBER:

- » Stay in your vehicle with the windows up
- » Please let volunteers unload your car
- » Go through the line only once
- » No smoking
- » No walk-ups
- » Remember, long wait times are possible
- » Bring products in original containers if possible
- » Separate & group items before drop-off
- » Limit 5 containers per car
- » Properly seal containers to prevent leaking
- » Do not mix or consolidate products
- » Trailers longer than 16 ft. not allowed
- » No contractor or business waste accepted
- » Transport containers in the back of vehicle away from passengers
- » Bins/baskets used to transport items will not be returned to residents
