# **Holiday Tree Recycling**

Residents can recycle real, unflocked holiday trees and wreaths at no additional charge during the first two weeks after December 25. Simply bring them to the WM Yard at 19201 Neuralia Rd, California City, CA 93505. Trees over four (4) feet must be cut in half, and all decorations—including tinsel, lights, ornaments, and



Prefer curbside pickup? You can also place your real, undecorated, unflocked tree in your green organics cart for composting. Trees must fit completely inside the cart with the lid closed, so those taller than four (4) feet should be cut in half.

# **Residential Drop-Off** Center

Residential customers in good standing can drop off recyclables, bulky



items, mattresses, appliances, wood waste, green waste, and metal for free at the Residential Drop Off Facility at 19201 Neuralia Rd, California City, CA 93505.

- · One vehicle load per resident per week.
- · No regular household trash, commercial waste, propane/helium tanks, or hazardous waste is accepted.
- Ensure wood waste is no longer than 4 feet.

Hours: Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.; Saturday, 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. (excluding holidays).

For larger disposal needs, residents can visit the Mojave-Rosamond Landfill for free.

When your collection day falls on/or after one of these holidays, your collection will be delayed by one day that week only. If a holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, there will be no delay.







#### Free Bulky Item Pickup

You can schedule up to three (3) bulky item collections per year at no extra cost. Schedule at least 48 hours before your service day Visit home.wm.com/california-city or wm.com/MyWM to book online.

Accepted: furniture, appliances, wrapped mattresses, electronics

**Not accepted:** hazardous waste, industrial items, liquids, construction debris.

## **How to Handle Organics**

Place food scraps, yard trimmings, and other organic materials in your green container. No plastic bags, please. They clog machines and contaminate compost. You may use a paper bag, box, or a compostable bag that meets ASTM D6400 standards.

#### Health & Environmental Impact

Landfilling organic waste creates harmful greenhouse gases and leachate. Recycling organics protects air quality, soil health, and our community.



# Illegal Dumping: Let's Keep California City Clean

Leaving junk, garbage, or debris on public or private property—like roadsides, alleys, or open lots—without permission is considered illegal dumping.
