## Cart Set Out Information



Wheel carts to curb by 7:00 a.m. on your collection day. Residential collection will be provided from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Carts may be set out for 24 hour period only for the purposes of collection.

Place flattened cardboard (up to 4' x 4'), used motor oil (up to 3 gallons), and oil filters (up to three) between carts at the curb.



Carts can be collected from backyards for an additional fee, or no fee for qualifying disabled individuals. Call [\(510\) 613-8710](tel:5106138710) for details.

**Service holidays** are Thanksgiving, Christmas, New Year's Day. When holiday lands on weekday, collection will be one day later for rest of week.

## Need to Get Rid of More?



**Neighborhood bulky pickups** are scheduled for the month of April. Watch for future mailers with exact dates and information. In addition, you may **order an individual pickup** once per year. Call [\(510\) 613-8710](tel:5106138710) to schedule your pickup.



Residents and businesses can bring up to **five mattresses or box springs per day to WM's Davis Street facility for free**, Mon. - Fri., 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Sat., 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. at 2615 Davis Street, San Leandro, CA 94577. A per item fee applies beyond the first five (5) mattresses or box springs. Visit [davisstreet.wm.com](http://davisstreet.wm.com) for other drop off options and rates.

## Mandatory Sorting of Recyclables and Compostables

State Law (SB 1383) and county ordinances (ORRO) mandate that Alameda County residents must sort compostable and recyclable materials into the appropriate containers. ## Have Hard to Dispose Items?



Call WM at [\(510\) 613-8710](tel:5106138710) to have a **free jug for used motor oil** delivered to you. Put used filters in a customer-provided sealed plastic bag.



**Free battery collection:** Tape a clear plastic, sealed bag of batteries (all alkaline, small button, rechargeable and cell phone batteries) onto your GRAY curbside recycling cart.

**CFLs:** Free LampTracker mail-back collection containers are available by calling WM at [\(510\) 613-8710](tel:5106138710).

**Holiday Trees** are collected curbside in single family neighborhoods in January. Trees must be CLEAN (no flocking, decorations or stands) and cut to less than 6' tall.

## Avoid Contamination and Overage Charges

Contamination surcharges will be implemented when incorrect materials are discovered in the recycling or compost carts (after two warnings).
