Why SB 1383

SB 1383 aims to slow climate change by diverting organic materials from landfills, recovering 20% of edible food, and redirecting it to food-insecure Californians. City of Fowler Residents,

You can recycle trees and wreaths during the first two weeks in January at no additional cost! Trees longer than six (6) feet must be cut in half and placed into your green waste container. Please remove all decorations including tinsel, lights, ornaments and tree stands.

Free Bulk Item Collection

Residents receive up two disposal vouchers in their June invoice effective July 1, 2025 - June 30, 2026. Also residents can participate in two community drop off days in the Spring and in the Fall. For dates refer to home.wm.com/fowler or https://fowlercity.org/

Acceptable items include: chairs, rugs, refrigerators, sofas, washers, dryers, small household appliances, televisions, stereos, computers, tree trunks, large branches (no more than six (6) inches in diameter or four (4) feet in length) rocks, etc.

Non-acceptable items include: any material containing asbestos, sandblast, waste containing hazardous materials, or any form of unacceptable waste.

Household Hazardous Waste

The Fresno County Environmental Compliance Center accepts a variety of hazardous materials, including yard chemicals, pool chemicals, cleaning chemicals, automotive fluids, and other chemicals. The facility is located at 1327 W. Dan Ronquillo Dr., Fresno, CA 93706, and is open on most Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. It also accepts materials from qualifying small businesses by appointment only. Small business customers are required to pay only the disposal cost.

Household Hazardous Waste Network

In partnership with the 15 incorporated cities throughout Fresno County, the County offers a program known as the Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Network for residents.

The HHW Network consists of local drop-off sites that accept the five most common types of household hazardous waste: paint, household batteries, sharps, fluorescent tubes and bulbs, and e-waste. Please note that these sites are limited to household quantities and do NOT accept business waste.

What Goes in the Organics Container:

· Your dark gray cart with a green lid will be for organic waste collection. You may use a paper or compostable bag that meets ASTM D6400 standards or place organic waste loosely in the cart.
