## SUMMER SAFETY TIPS

Certain household items require special handling before disposal. Items such as hot coals, batteries, and small propane tanks are often unstable and can increase the risk of fire if not disposed of properly. Let's prioritize safety for our loved ones, neighbors, and drivers by following these guidelines:



### HOT COALS

Make sure hot coals are fully extinguished before placing in the trash. Place in a metal container and drench in water and/or wait several days before placing in the trash.

### BATTERIES

Household (C, D, AA, AAA, etc.) and lithium batteries should be disposed of at a household hazardous waste disposal site or placed in a plastic bag and left on top of your recycling cart.



### PROPANE TANKS

Never place any type of propane tank in your trash, recycling or organics cart. These materials should be disposed of at a household hazardous waste facility.

### POOL CHEMICALS

These items must be taken to the residential household hazardous waste drop-off site at McCourtney Road (14741 Wolf Mountain Rd, Grass Valley. Wed - Sun: 8 am to 3:30 pm.
