



Holiday Tree Recycling

Curbside tree collection for residents will occur on regular collection days from December 26, 2025 - January 10, 2026. Trees are to be placed at the curb or in the Organics cart for collection and adhere to

the collection guidelines:





 Flocked trees will be collected but cannot be recycled.

Additional Material Collection

Residents can place bags of additional trash, recycling or organic waste (not bulky items) next to their trash carts for collection day only from **December 26, 2025 - January 10, 2026.**

Holidays

WM observes the following holidays:

New Year's Day | Independence Day | Labor Day | Thanksgiving Day | Christmas Day

Collection service will be delayed one day following the above holidays. If a holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, there will be no delays.







FREE Bulky Item Pick-Up

Making room for holiday gifts? Single and multifamily residents can schedule up to six (6) free bulky item pick-ups per year, with up to three (3) items per visit. Just be sure to book your appointment at least 48 hours in advance of your

collection day. Items collected at the curb/where carts are placed on your regular collection day. Appointments requested less than 48 hours from collection day cannot be guaranteed.

Acceptable Bulky Waste Items:

Furniture, appliances, electronic equipment (e-waste), tires, car motor parts, tree branches and scrap wood.

Unacceptable Items:

Household hazardous waste (such as paint, oil and batteries), spas, camper shells, cast iron bathtubs, items requiring more than two persons to safely handle.

Bulky items must be under 8 feet long, 4 feet wide, and weigh no more than 150 pounds. Sign up or log in to your My WM account to schedule your pick up. Pick up must be scheduled at least 48 hours before your regular service day.



Acceptable items include:

Automotive products: Antifreeze, motor oil, oil filters, brake fluid, transmission fluid, cleaners, upholstery cleaner, polishes, fuels and waxes

Batteries: Household and vehicle

Household chemicals: Carpet and upholstery cleaners, tile and shower cleaners, drain cleaners, cleaning compounds and rust removers

Household items: Hobby glue, nail polish removers, and more

Electronics: Televisions, desktop computers, laptops, tablets, monitors, mouse, keyboards, mp3 players, DVD players, gaming consoles, CD/tape players, VCRs, cell phones, desktop printer, scanner, fax machines, microwaves, CD rom and related cords

WM's At Your Door Special Collection®

Manhattan Beach residents can safely and conveniently dispose of household hazardous waste and electronic waste using WM's At Your Door Special Collection®

Through this program, WM collects the materials directly from your house!

It's Convenient and Easy:

Simply call (800) 449-7587 to schedule your pick-up.

Mercury containing items: Compact Fluorescent Lamp, straight fluorescent tubes, thermometers and thermostats

Paint products: Latex and oil based paint, spray paint, paint thinner, stain, stripper, caulk, sealer, wood stain and wood preservative

Garden chemicals: Fertilizer, herbicide, pesticide

Swimming pool chemicals: Pool acid, stabilizer and chlorine

Unable to Collect: Ammunition, EV batteries, explosives, asbestos, tires, or any materials in unlabeled or leaking containers.

Why Organics Recycling Matters

California's SB 1383, effective January 1, 2022, requires all cities to offer residential organics recycling—and for residents to participate. Organics include yard trimmings, food scraps, and soiled paper, which make up a large portion of landfill waste and contribute to harmful methane emissions.

As a California resident and steward of the environment, you can make a difference by reducing waste and properly sorting materials that can't be reused.

How to Participate in Organics Recycling

- Put yard waste, food scraps and soiled paper together in the green organics cart. Check out page 4 of this newsletter for examples of what can go inside!
- No plastic/bioplastic allowed in the organics cart.

Need a New Cart?

Manhattan Beach residents can request a cart replacement once per year at no additional charge. Request your cart by visiting home.wm.com/manhattan-beach.



Simple Ways to Keep Your Green Cart Clean

Store food and soiled paper scraps in a sealed counter top container until you're ready to transfer them to your organics cart.

To reduce odors and mess, you can also freeze scraps in a bag or container—just remember to remove them before placing in your green organics cart. No plastics of any kind are allowed, including biodegradable or compostable bags.

Let's Get Back to The Basics of Recycling.

Remember these three simple rules each time you recycle:



Recycle empty and dry bottles, cans, paper and cardboard.



Keep food and liquid out of your recycling.



No loose plastic bags and no bagged recyclables.
