## Senate Bill 1383

Since January 1, 2022, all Orange County residents are required by state law (SB 1383) to separate food waste from trash and place it in their green organics cart along with yard waste. Each household should have three carts: one for trash, one for recycling, and one for organics.

To align with statewide standards by 2036, all carts will eventually have uniform colors:

- Green lid for organics (food and yard waste)
- · Blue lid for recycling
- · Black lid for trash

These changes will happen gradually. When you receive new carts, remember to "Check the Lid" for correct sorting guidelines.

# Senior & Low-Income Discounts Available

Qualifying seniors are eligible to receive a discount of approximately 10% off their waste collection bill.



# How do I qualify for the Senior Discount?

- Must provide proof of 65 years of age or older
- · Must be head of household
- Must use 35-gallon carts only

### How do I qualify for the Low-Income Discount?

- Must provide proof of low income by being enrolled in "California Lifeline" telephone program or CARE/FERA program, or by submitting a copy of utility bill showing a low-income discount
- Must have name on utility bill or another low-income program
- · Must be head of household

The centers listed above are open Tuesday - Saturday, 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. (Closed holidays and rainy days).

# **Holiday Tree Recycling**

WM will collect and recycle Christmas trees, starting on December 26, for three (3) consecutive weeks at no additional charge. Trees will be collected at the curb and picked up by special flatbed trucks. After the three-week period, you may cut your tree and place the pieces in your green waste cart with the lid completely closed.



- Trees taller than six (6) feet must be cut in half.
- · Please remove all decorations including tinsel, lights, ornaments and tree stands.
- Flocked trees will be collected but not recycled.

# **Holiday Schedule**

Residential collection service will be delayed one day following the above holidays. If a holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, there will be no delay.



# Free Bulky Item Pick-Ups

Residents in Unincorporated Orange County are eligible for three (3) free bulky item pickups per year, with up to four (4) items per pickup. Accepted items include furniture, appliances, or up to 20 bags of trash or green waste. Electronic waste—such as TVs, computers, monitors, and DVD players—is also accepted.
