Free Paper Shredding for Earth Day

Free paper shredding services will be offered during the Earth Day Celebration on Thursday, April 18, from 3:30 to 6:00 p.m. Each person can shred up to three (3) boxes of paper. Please do not bring paper in bags, which can slow the process.

Accepted Items:

- Confidential documents
- White or colored paper
- Manila file folders (including staples and paperclips)
- Envelopes
- Cardboard

Items Not Accepted:

- CDs, hard drives, and cell phones
- 3-ring binders
- Metal objects, plastics, glass, and plastic bags
- Food materials
- Batteries
- Weapons



Tips to Recycle Right®

WM collects and sorts a significant number of recyclables from households across Rolling Hills Estates every day.

However, many of the items placed in recycling carts are actually considered trash. Recycling contamination is caused when trash items are introduced to the recycling stream. Contaminants can include items such as hoses, wires, yard waste, and food waste. Recycling contamination has the potential to jeopardize otherwise good recyclables. For example, food or liquids placed in the recycling cart will contaminate paper and cardboard by saturating the materials and making them impossible to recycle. If it can't be recycled, it unfortunately becomes trash.

You can prevent this problem by following these simple rules to recycle right:







Keep food and liquid out of your recycling.



No loose plastic bags and no bagged recyclables.

Recycling Hero Contest

Every quarter, the City's top recyclers are nominated by their drivers to enter the WM Recycling Hero contest. A winner is selected at random during the quarterly City Council meeting. He or she will receive a year's worth of free residential trash and recycling services!

How to enter: All you have to do is recycle as much as you can to divert your trash from our waste streams. This saves energy and natural resources and reduces our dependence on landfills. Your driver will do the rest!



The California State Legislature passed Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383), which requires cities to reduce organic waste disposal by 75% by 2025. Effective January 1, 2022, all California businesses, multifamily complexes, and residences are required to sort food scraps and yard debris from trash and recycling into an organics cart.

Bread, Pasta, Rice & Grains

Place organics materials directly into your organics cart - To reduce odor, put food waste in a paper bag.

What Goes in the Recycling Container:



Plastic Bottles & Containers



Food & Beverage Cans



Glass Bottles & Containers



Paper



Flattened Cardboard & Paperboard

Place recyclables directly into your recycling cart - Don't bag your recycling materials.
