2026 Residential Waste and Recycling Service Guide



Dear Residents of Westlake Village:

WM is proud to be your service provider. We look forward to providing you with courteous and dependable curbside collection and helping to keep Westlake Village, safe, clean, and green.

Carts and Service Information

WM provides the following carts for weekly collection service:

- Trash Gray cart with black lid
- · Recycle Gray cart with blue lid
- · Organic Waste Gray cart with green lid







Proper Cart Placement

Remember to place your carts at least three feet apart and three feet away from any obstacles (trees, cars, mailboxes, etc.) to allow the automatic arm to lift and empty the carts. Place the wheels of each cart toward your house.

- Place all trash, recyclables, and organics material in the appropriate containers and make sure that the cart lid is closed.
- Any trash, recyclables, and organics outside the cart will not be collected.
- Have your carts at the curb the night before or no later than 6 a.m. on your collection day.

Note: Additional carts for trash, recycling, and organic waste are available for a small fee. Residents with cracked or broken carts can receive a free replacement.

Bulky Item Pickup

Residents can request two free pickups per year, with a maximum of six items or 10 32-gallon bags per pickup. Additional pickups are available for a fee. Schedule via your My WM account.

Senior Discount

A 10% discount is available for residents aged 62 or older who are service account holders and heads of household. Excludes Low-Income Discount Program participants. Download the form at home.wm.com/westlake-village or visit the WM G.I. Office.

Home Compost Bin

Request a complimentary compost bin.

Free Landfill Days

Dispose of two loads at the Simi Valley Landfill on Sundays, April 19, June 21, and September 20, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. ID required. For more info, visit the website.

Low Income Discount

Available for residents who:

- Are enrolled in a discounted utility program and identified as low, very low, or extremely low income.
- Are the service account holder and head of the household.
- Currently occupy the residence and are not in the Senior Discount Program.

Household Hazardous Waste Home Collection Service

Residents can schedule free curbside pickup of Household Hazardous Waste on the fourth week of each month. To arrange a pickup, visit www.wmatyourdoor.com or call (800) 449-7587 Monday through Friday from 5 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Free Shred Event

Secure shredding for documents is available twice a year, in April and October. Check the website for specific dates.

Cart Valet Service

WM offers a Cart Valet Service for residents who have difficulty moving their waste containers. This service is free for households with adults with disabilities.

Holidays

WM observes the following holidays.

- New Year's Day
- Memorial Day
- Independence Day
- Labor Day
- Thanksgiving Day
- Christmas Day

When your collection day falls on/or after one of these holidays, your collection will be delayed by one day for that week only.

2026 Free Compost Days

The free compost giveaways for 2026 will take place on April 19 and September 20, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Simi Valley Landfill and Recycling Center. This will be a self-serve event. Residents are encouraged to bring shovels, gloves, and sturdy containers.

Most Common Contaminants

Keep these common contaminants OUT of your recycling bin.



No Recyclables In Plastic Bags

Empty recyclables directly into your bin.



No Food & Liquids

Compost instead! Otherwise it belongs in the trash.



No Batteries, Power Tools, Flammables or **Hazardous Waste***

(Not in recycling or trash.) Batteries, propane tanks, and similar items can be a fire or explosion hazard.



No Loose Plastic Bags or Film

Take plastic bags back to local retailers where available.



No Electronics & Small Appliances

Donate if in good condition, or schedule a bulky item pickup, if available.



No Textiles, Bedding, **Rugs & Carpet**

Donate these items if they are in good condition. Rugs and carpets can be placed in a Bagster® bag. Visit thebagster.com to learn more.



No Tanglers, Holiday Lights, Hangers & **Extension Cords**

They wrap around equipment and can shut down an entire facility! They all go in the trash.



No Paper Towels, Napkins, Plates & **Tissues**

Compost if possible, and remember to recycle the cardboard tube.



No Polystyrene or Polystyrene Foam

Foam is not accepted in single stream recycling.



No Tires, Auto Parts & Scrap Metal

(Not in recycling or trash.) Can damage equipment and are safety hazards. Contact your local scrap recyclers or retail tire stores for recycling options.



No Concrete, Wood & **Construction Debris**

Can damage equipment. Consider ordering a roll off container on wm.com or a Bagster® bag by visiting thebagster.com.



No Yard Waste

Compost or put in your yard waste cart, if available. Otherwise it belongs in the trash.

Ensure food scraps are placed in a plastic bag or paper bag before placing in your organics cart.
