More Support When You Need it Most

The holiday season is a time for joy and celebration, but it's also when waste generation tends to spike. To help Fernley residents manage the additional waste efficiently, we've outlined services available in your area:

Extra Waste Voucher



Whether it's wrapping paper, or seasonal clean-ups, many customers have extra waste to dispose of this time of year. If you haven't used your annual waste voucher yet, there's still time. Bring your voucher and extra waste to the Fernley Transfer Station, along with a utility bill or driver's license matching your service address, and ensure your account is current. New vouchers will be mailed to residents at the start of 2026.

Beyond Trash Collection

Recycle your materials by dropping them off at your local transfer station at no additional charge. This not only frees up space in your trash cart but also ensures recyclable items can be manufactured into new products. See voucher for acceptable items. Location and operating hours:

Christmas Tree Disposal



The City of Fernley will accept natural Christmas trees for free recycling at the Out-of-Town Park in the Rodeo Grounds from Dec. 26, 2025 through Jan. 16, 2026. Trees can be dropped off in the designated area, Monday to Friday, from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Trees must be free of any decorations, nails, stands, or flocking. Please follow the guidelines to allow the City to continue this program.





For a Safe and Happy New Year

At WM, we are dedicated to delivering reliable waste solutions while prioritizing the safety of our employees and communities. With your support, we can accomplish even more. Become a safety champion by only placing accepted materials in your trash carts and handling them properly for curbside pickup. Continue reading to learn how you can help us maintain safe operations throughout the year.



Did you know that not all waste materials should go in your trash cart? Common household hazardous items, such as lithium batteries, car batteries, fireworks, firearms, ammunition, gunpowder, and explosives, can be dangerous if tossed in your curbside cart. If these materials are found in the cart, it will be tagged with a non-collection notice and will not be serviced. It will then be your responsibility to make the correction and contact WM for service.



Where and how you place your curbside carts is just as important as what's inside them. To prevent accidents, keep carts at least 3 feet apart from each other and other objects. Ensure the lids are tightly closed. Overfilled carts generally spill, littering our streets and posing unnecessary risks to pedestrians, animals, and the environment.



Serving your residence is our top priority. However, when inclement weather prevents us from safely reaching your home, we will work diligently to reschedule your service or find alternative solutions that prioritize the safety of our drivers, trucks, and communities.
