

Landfill Diversion

Organic waste in landfills is a major source of methane emissions. By separating yard debris and trimmings from regular trash, you help ensure these materials can be composted rather than wasted—turning organic matter into valuable, nutrient-rich soil instead of harmful greenhouse gases.

Closed-Loop Solution

Transforming yard waste, trimmings, and organic materials into compost, soil, and mulch supports a closed-loop system—where natural resources are renewed and returned to the earth, benefiting farmers, growers, and landscapers alike.

Community-Oriented

Did you know the yard debris collected in Incline Village stays right in Nevada? Through a collaboration with Full Circle Soil & Compost, yard waste is turned into soil and compost without leaving the state. It's a homegrown solution that benefits the entire community.

Residents can use Yard Debris Stickers to dispose of yard waste at no cost on regular pickup day until **July 18**. Bags must be securely tied and not exceed 40 lbs. Untied or overweight bags will not be collected. The Yard Debris Recycling Program will be available again from September 29 to October 31, 2025.





Labor Day Hazardous Waste Drop-Off

Residents of Incline Village and Crystal Bay can take advantage of a convenient way to safely dispose of household hazardous waste this Labor Day (September 1), with support from the Incline Village General Improvement District.

This drop-off service, available by appointment only, accepts items such as old electronics, paint, cleaners, fertilizers, poisons, and other chemicals—helping protect our community and watershed from harmful materials.

Bust Recycling Myths & Become the Expert in Your Home

MYTH:

The recycling arrows (Mobius) on a container or package mean it is recyclable at a Material Recovery Facility (MRF).

ANSWER: Only in some cases.

The Mobius symbol (three chasing arrows) doesn't necessarily mean an item is recyclable in your curbside cart. With thousands of types of plastic packaging—each with different chemical makeups—it's best to recycle by shape, not by symbol. Stick with plastic bottles, jars, jugs, and tubs.
