Holiday Reminder & Best Practices

WM will provide collection as usual on Memorial Day (May 26). Please set your carts out by 6 a.m. on your service day with wheels against the curb and lids fully closed to ensure proper collection. Avoid overfilling your cart to prevent windblown litter, and keep carts at least three feet apart from other objects so WM drivers can service them efficiently.
