#### FREE BATTERY AND COMPACT FLUORESCENT BULB (CFL) COLLECTION FOR ALL RESIDENTS

Batteries: Tape a clear plastic, sealed bag of batteries (all alkaline, small button, rechargeable and cell phone batteries) onto your GRAY curbside recycling cart (Cart customers only).

CFLs: Free collection boxes are available by calling WM (below). No recycling cart? Property owners/managers, call Waste Management at (510) 613-8710 for free battery collection container.

#### FREE HOLIDAY TREE-CYCLING PICKUP

Holiday trees are collected during the first two weeks of January. Collection and set out method and instructions/ may vary. Clean trees only: no "snow" flocking, stands or decorations. Trees must be cut to less than 5 feet tall.

Large Property Service - Owners/managers of large properties may call Waste Management at (510) 613-8710 to receive a free roll-off box for holiday tree-cycling.

#### **BULKY ITEM PICKUP**

Multi-family properties are eligible for bulky item pickup twice a year. Service is dependent on the size and location of the property. Property owners/managers, call Waste Management at (510) 613-8710 to schedule a collection. Single-family neighborhoods, watch for the annual April collection event.

No loose plastic bags are allowed in the COMPOST or RECYCLING containers. Commercial customers may use either clear bags (where the contents are visible) or BPI compostable bags to contain organic material.
