Bulky Spring Clean-Up Event: April 8 & 9

Your residential address may be eligible for the free “Spring Clean-up” event that occurs on the same day as your regular collection day. See reverse side or visit emeryville.wm.com to view a map and list of addresses for eligibility.



Free On-call Bulky Pickup Appointments

All residential account holders in or out of the clean-up area are also eligible for at least one free on-call pickup from WM annually. Call 510-613-8710 to make an appointment.

CLEAN-UP GUIDELINES

- Place on curb before 6 a.m. on the day of your clean-up.
- Total amount limited to 2 cubic yards or 16 large trash bags.
- Loose bulky waste items must be bagged or boxed.
- No bulky set outs more than 24 hours prior to pick-up.

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

- Bundled or bagged bulky waste items (trash cans will not be returned)
- Household appliances
- Tires
- Furniture, mattresses
- TV's and computers
- Yard waste (branches & wood must not exceed 4 ft. long or 6 in. in diameter; branches & tree limbs must be bundled; clean, untreated, unpainted wood only)

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED

- Items over 6 feet
- Items over 75 lbs, except appliances and furniture.
- Wet garbage, rocks, dirt or concrete
- Hazardous waste or toxic materials
- Batteries of any kind or other automobile parts

What Do I Do with Used Batteries and Used Motor Oil and Filters?

The City of Emeryville and WM offer free ways to dispose of them properly.

FREE HOUSEHOLD BATTERY RECYCLING



Put used batteries in a clear zip-lock bag. Place sealed bag on top of your gray recycling cart on your regular pickup date.

Do not put in the cart

Include ONLY Household Dry-Cell Batteries such as: Alkaline, Button Cell, Ni-Cadmium Batteries.

FREE MOTOR OIL COLLECTION



Call WM at (510) 613-8710 to have a free used motor oil jug delivered to you. Put used filters in your own sealed plastic bag.

Place filled motor oil recycling jug & filter bag curbside, next to the gray recyclables cart on your regular pickup day. **Do not put in the cart.**
