# Temescal Valley Students Applauded for Inspiring Recycling Messages

## Students earn their schools \$1,800 in donations for winning recycling themed art contest

**TEMESCAL VALLEY, Calif. - December 16, 2015** - Riverside County First District Supervisor Kevin Jeffries, Assemblywomen Melissa Melendez and the office of Senator Jeff Stone recently joined the Waste Management El Sobrante Landfill to congratulate 12 winners of a local America Recycles Day Calendar Art Contest.

Sponsored by a Keep America Beautiful and Waste Management Think Green Grant<sup>®</sup>, the contest challenged Temescal Valley children to illustrate the theme "Give your trash another life, recycle often and recycle right!" and depict the positive impacts communities could have by recycling correctly. Since 2008, the El Sobrante Landfill has applied for and received a total of \$38,000 in annual Think Green Grants<sup>®</sup> and has utilized the funds to organize cleanup events and environmental learning programs with the support of local volunteers and the Temescal Heritage Foundation.

During the awards ceremony, which took place at a Temescal Valley Municipal Advisory Council Meeting, Supervisor Jeffries, Assemblywomen Melendez and the office of Senator Stone presented personalized certificates to the winners and congratulated them for their "green" artwork. Landfill staff also gave the students gift bags filled with art supplies and awarded El Cerrito Middle School and Todd Elementary School a combined total of \$1,800 for placing in the top three.
