Over 300 local students and boy scouts will participate in educational program

April. 16, 2012, Temescal Valley, CA - Throughout the month of April, over 300 boy scouts from local troops and elementary school students will visit the El Sobrante Landfill and its Wildlife Preserve to honor the 42nd Anniversary of Earth Day.

To help the youths gain an early appreciation for protecting the planet and preserving its resources, employees of the El Sobrante Landfill will be giving students an up-close look at the green innovation and sustainable solutions behind the landfill's operations.

Children will visit the El Sobrante Landfill and Wildlife Preserve on the following days:

- Tuesday and Thursday, April 17 and 19: 1st grade classes from Luiseno Elementary School Wednesday and Friday, April 18 and 20: 1st grade classes from Todd Elementary School

In addition to touring the landfill, students will visit the El Sobrante Wildlife Preserve, 688 acres of protected habitat for 31 native sensitive plants and wildlife species. A biologist will lead participants on an excursion where they will learn about the wildlife and their natural habitats.
