Free Green Waste Drop Off Events

Reduce the risk of wildfires and protect your home and our community by ensuring your property is fire safe.

Waste Management will hold two free green waste drop off events at the McCourtney Road Transfer Station.

Bring you green waste to the facility on August 17 and 24 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. for free disposal.

Curbside Green Waste Collection

You don't have to wait for the green waste event to get rid of your green waste, we'll haul it away from your curbside. Waste Management offers affordable green waste service so you don't have to make the trip to McCourtney Road Transfer Station.

Greening Our Community

Nevada County WASTE MANAGEMENT BAG & TAG Place sticker on 32-gallon bag (Max. Weight = 40 pounds) Place excess recycling next to your recycling cart and excess trash next to your trash cart on your service day.

Here is a quick overview of how to correctly use your bag-tags in order to get rid of your excess trash.

- Bag Tags are for bags only and the stickers may not be put on pieces of furniture or other over-sized objects.
- Only bags with Stickers will be accepted.
- These bags must be less than 40 lbs. and 32 gallons. **No more than 3 bags** at a time.
- Bags must be collected manually as automated trucks are not able to lift indivudial bags. Overly bulky, oddly shaped bags can be dangerous and difficult for drivers to lift.
- **No exceptions.** Bags that do not meet any of these criteria will be not be picked up.
- To discourage wildlife encounters, it is strongly recommend that you **do not put food or food soiled trash in these bags.**
- Remember to reuse, recycle and upcycle to reduce trash at the source and help the environment!

CHANGES IN 2020:

- No Green/Yard Waste in bags accepted from May 1, 2020. Any bags left by the green waste bin will not be serviced.
- No recycle material in bags accepted from Jan 1, 2021. Any bags left by the recycle bin will not be serviced

WHY THESE CHANGES? WHY NOW?

In order to make life easy for our customers, Waste Management had been accepting a variety of trash in these bags. However, changes in recycling markets have impacted the disposal of recycling garbage. The processing companies no longer accept plastic bags with any recyclable materials (including yard waste).

We want to do the right thing and help educate our eco-conscious customers how to Recycle Right.

Please Keep Cart Lids Closed

Materials must fit inside a container with the lid shut for regular service. Keeping lids closed and material inside containers helps:

- Minimize Service Delays
- Decrease Litter
- Prevent Rodents and Other Animal Scavengers
- Reduce Equipment Failure
- Eliminate Safety Risks
- Reduce Truck Fires

Recycle Right. Here's How:



Recycle only empty plastic, metal and aluminum bottles/containers, empty glass jars/bottles, and clean paper and cardboard. Keep lid closed to avoid paper getting wet.



No plastic bags. Place recyclables directly into your container.

Kee out

Keep food and liquids out of the recycling.



GREEN WASTE



Place only grass clippings, leaves, flowers, wood branches and untreated lumber in your yard waste in your yard waste cart.



No plastic bags. Place recyclables directly into your container.



No plastic, glass, metal, treated wood, hazardous or pet waste.
