WASTE MANAGEMENT TO DEMONSTRATE NEW SOLAR TRASH COMPACTOR AT OCEANSIDE PIER

Solar-powered Trash Receptacle Will Save Oceanside Collection Costs and Help Keep Pier Clean and Litter-free

WHAT: Waste Management of North County and City of Oceanside staff will demonstrate and

dedicate the new Waste Management Solar Trash Compactor at the foot of the Oceanside

Pier on Wednesday, Dec. 16 at 1:30 p.m.

WHY: The installation of Waste Management's new solar compactor is part of a new pilot

program that will test the innovative eco-technology's ability to harness the sun to reduce collection frequency. The solar compactor units use built-in solar panels to compact trash, which enables them to hold five times the capacity of a traditional trash receptacle. This cuts the need for trash pickup by up to 80 percent, which reduces collection costs, fuel use and greenhouse gas emissions. The compactors also include receptacles for collecting

plastic bottles, newspapers, glass and other recyclables.

Oceanside is the first of several planned sites selected by Waste Management to install the

new solar compactors throughout San Diego County.

Local dignitaries, the public and the media are invited to learn more about how the

technology can help them reduce collection costs and keep Oceanside clean.
