#### **HOLIDAY SERVICE SCHEDULE**

In 2017, the following holidays will impact your service schedule:

## **BULKY ITEM COLLECTION & RECYCLING**

If you have additional holiday trash, Waste Management can help. Irvine residents with curbside collection services are entitled to four free bulky item collections per calendar year.

If you are discarding items that are still in good condition, please let us know when you call in and we will arrange for them to be donated to Goodwill instead of sending them to the landfill.





# FREE RESIDENTIAL PAPER SHREDDING & RECYCLING

Waste Management now manages Irvine's free Paper Shred Events. Mark your calendars for our 2017 events. Both Shred Events will take place at the Lakeview Senior Center, 20 Lake Road in Irvine.

Residents may bring up to five banker-size file boxes (dimensions 24" wide x 12" high) for free disposal, shredding, and recycling. Shredding will take place on site. A donation receptacle to drop-off gently used clothing will also be provided onsite. Proof of Irvine residency is required.

#### "AT YOUR DOOR" HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION

**At Your Door** is a new door-to-door household hazardous waste (HHW) collection program offered at no cost to qualifying senior or disabled Irvine residents.

Once per year, qualifying residents can request postage-paid mail back containers to safely dispose of waste such as automotive products, home cleaners, garden chemicals, electronics, paint products, and non-controlled medicine. A complete list of acceptable materials and instructions will be included in the mail back packet.

All residents may continue to drop off HHW at the
