California Required Organics Recycling City of Lodi

What is it?

Beginning in 2022, Senate Bill 1383 encourages all California businesses, multifamily complexes and residences to sort food scraps, food-soiled paper, and yard debris from trash and recycling, and subscribe to compost collection service. By 2024 City's will be required to enforce these practices by ordinance. This initial mailer is intended to provide our customers with information regarding SB 1383 so you can be prepared for this new requirement. Additional customer outreach will be forthcoming to assist in this transition. While this requirement is new, Waste Management is currently prepared to accommodate organics recycling.

What are customers encouraged to do?

Tips for Easier Sorting Organics: Use your own containers or a kitchen pail to collect your food scraps in your home. Empty directly into your green organics cart or use a paper bag to collect your compost and place the bag and all into the green organics cart. Use shredded paper to line your containers or carts to help soak up liquids and odors.



Currently, organics recycling containers are serviced bi-weekly. Weekly organics pick-up is anticipated to begin this summer. Weekly servicing is planned to minimize potential odors and enhance service quality.
