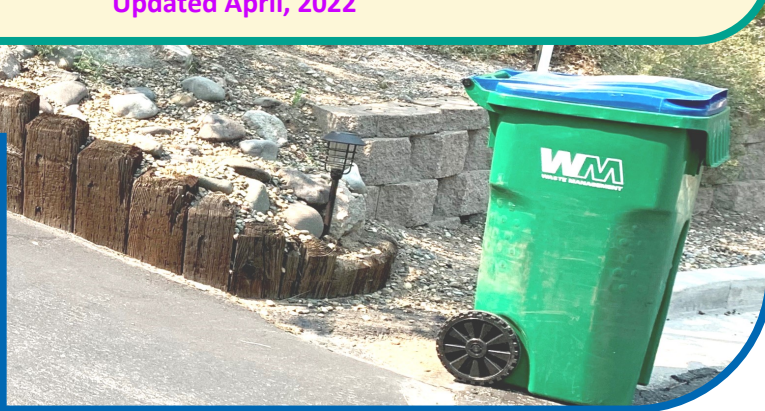

STASH YOUR TRASH!

TAHOE'S BLACK BEARS ARE ACTIVE YEAR-ROUND

Solid Waste Compliance and Enforcement is active.

It is YOUR responsibility to contain and secure all trash and recycling at your property.

Cart lids must close completely.

Trash and recycling carts may be placed curbside
NO EARLIER THAN 5 a.m. ON YOUR DAY OF SERVICE
or invest in a Bear Shed.

Rinse and clean all recyclable items.

Leaving town before service day? Visit the Transfer Station to drop off your trash and recycling in-lieu.

IVGID ORDINANCE ONE (SOLID WASTE):

A Residential service violation shall include but not be limited to:

- Solid waste being placed at the curb on the wrong specified pick-up day or prior to 5:00 a.m. on the pick-up day.
- Solid waste spilled on the property outside the building.
- Solid waste placed at the curb for service on the pick-up day at the proper time but not properly contained within the container.
- Loose or non-contained garbage placed next to the container.
- Overflowing Container.
- Garbage placed in bags next to the container at the curb.
- Anything in the judgement of the Director of Public Works which constitutes a violation of the General Provisions of this Ordinance.
- Yard debris is properly bagged and identified with the collector provided tag for the current year shall only be placed at the curb for pick-up during the annually designated 16-week timeframe for the yard debris program in accordance with the published procedures. All other times of placement at the curb are a violation.

A Commercial Service Violation shall include but not be limited to:

- An overfilled dumpster.
- A dumpster not secured, dumpster not tightly closed and locked or latched (there shall be no gap between lid and bin).
- Solid waste on top of or outside of dumpster.
- Solid waste inside or outside of enclosure.
- Enclosure doors not secured.
- Solid waste spilled around the enclosure.
- Anything in the judgement of the Director of Public Works which constitutes a violation of the General Provisions of this Ordinance.

Authorized Remedies for Non-Compliance:

- Termination of utility service(s);
- Assessment of fees established by the District.

Residential Waste Service Fee Schedule for Non-Compliance with Ordinance Provisions

1st Offense	Mandatory 64 or 96 gallon Enhanced Wildlife Resistant Cart (WRC) Service
2nd Offense	\$100 to \$999
3rd and Subsequent Offenses	\$500 to \$999

- Fees are non-refundable except upon relief provided under appeal process or with installation of bear shed within 60 days of billed fee or mutually agreed upon time frame.

Commercial Waste Service Fee Schedule for Non-Compliance with Ordinance Provisions

1st Offense	Up to \$999
2nd and Subsequent Offenses	\$500 to \$999

- Fees are non-refundable except upon relief provided under appeal process or with use of enhanced wildlife resistant dumpster within 60 days of billed fee or mutually agreed upon time frame.
- An empty dumpster is not a violation if left unlatched.

Prevent Violations: Invest in a Bear Shed OR Request a Park Style Dumpster from Waste Management.

RESIDENTIAL TRASH SERVICE INFORMATION

Best option: Lock your trash in an animal-resistant metal enclosure (Bear Shed OR Park Style Dumpster).

2nd best option: Keep your trash in an animal-resistant cart. Animal resistant poly-carts are now available to rent in Incline Village and Crystal Bay. Contact Waste Management at (775) 831-2971 for more information.

Less effective option: Trash storage in a lockable building with curbside placement, only after 5 a.m. on the morning of pick-up is permitted. However, this practice is strongly discouraged since bears have broken into buildings by way of garage doors and open windows for trash and other attractants.

Curbside spills from any type of container will result in violations.

INSTALLING A BEAR SHED/BOX (METAL GARBAGE CAN ENCLOSURE)

If you are looking into installing a bear shed in Incline Village or Crystal Bay, we strongly suggest you consider the following before you begin (more information available at bearsmartinclinevillage.org):

- **Size:** All putrescible trash (food waste and non-recyclable packaging) must fit in the shed easily. A variety of sizes are available that fit 1, 2 or 3 (32 gallon) cans provided by the homeowner. Excess capacity is highly encouraged.
- **Location:** The container must be placed on private property. The ideal location is 12 to 20 feet from the edge of pavement (curb), with easy access for trash collection service. Sheds cannot be located over utility service easements, nor in the public right-of-way.
- **Right of way:** In Incline and Crystal Bay, the public right-of-way varies from 3 to 30 or more feet, so, you must be certain the shed is located on your own property. A revocable encroachment permit can be granted from Washoe County for sheds that are installed less than 12 feet from the edge of pavement.
- **Help with bear shed location:** In Incline/Crystal Bay, IVGID Waste Not (775-832-1284), Washoe County Roads Department (775-832-4125) and Waste Management (775-831-2971) can provide assistance in the site location for your shed. Local vendors of the sheds will also assist homeowners in box placement selection.
- **Serviceability:** Locations further than 20 feet from the edge of pavement (curb) are subject to an additional monthly house service fee from Waste Management. Sheds must be cleared of vehicles, objects (6 feet minimum clearance) and snow in winter. Waste Management has the right to refuse to collect from a location which is inaccessible. - **Call 811:** Get utility connections marked by calling 811 or visit call811.com at least 3 days BEFORE you begin installation.

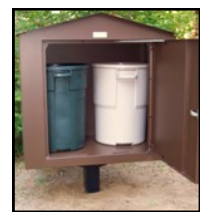

The Transfer Station is closed on Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Collection routes operate on all holidays.

The transfer station accepts putrescible waste, construction and demolition debris, bulky items, major appliances (washers, dryers, refrigerators, freezers and ovens), motor oil, anti-freeze and recyclable items (cardboard, paper, newspaper, magazines, junk mail, aluminum and steel cans, glass bottles and jars as well as all hard plastics).

BULKY ITEM DROP OFF

Residential customers may drop off up to three (3) cubic yards of trash, including furniture, appliances, and construction debris, four (4) times per year at the transfer station free of charge. Customers must present utility bill, IVGID card or state issued identification card with service address and be current in their trash payment.

COURTESY TRASH DROP OFF

Are you leaving town before trash collection day? As a courtesy, single family home customers may drop off the equivalent of weekly curbside allocation of household trash and recycling at no cost (must present utility bill, IVGID card or state issued identification card with service address and be current in payment). When this option is chosen, the property will not receive collection on their next scheduled service day. If carts with materials are left curbside when this option is exercised, your account will be changed for an additional collection.

CHRISTMAS TREE COLLECTION

Waste Management offers one week of curbside Christmas tree pick-up in early January. Trees should be cut into 3 foot sections. They must also be free of flocking, tinsel, decorations and stands. No wreaths, garland, or poinsettias. Check inclinevillage.wm.com for program dates and additional information.

YARD WASTE

Each year, residential customers get 96 stickers for curbside collection of yard debris which will be composted. Stickers and collection dates are mailed to billing address on record. Collection occurs over 12 weeks in the spring and 4 weeks in the fall. Bags with stickers should be left for curbside collection on your regular trash day during the designated period. Yard waste left curbside outside of this timeframe is trash and should be disposed of accordingly. Check inclinevillage.wm.com for program dates & details.

Additional Services and Important Information



WILDLIFE RESISTANT CONTAINERS

Locking, wildlife resistant trash carts are available for a small monthly fee from Waste Management.



PARK STYLE DUMPSTER

Park style wildlife resistant dumpsters are available to commercial accounts through Waste Management. Rate incentives for service of a customer supplied park style dumpster are in place. This service level includes a 96-gallon recycling cart.

SIDE YARD SERVICE

Carts can be collected from side yards for an additional fee, or no fee for qualifying, disabled individuals.

SHARPS

Used syringes, needles, lancets and scalpel blades cannot go in your trash. *They are a biohazard and safety issue.*

Pick up a free sharps collection container at the Waste Management office during regular business hours. Each Sharps container comes with pre-paid return mailing to the treatment facility for certified destruction.

CLOSE THE LID ON OVERAGES

Customers may incur overage charges and solid waste violations when trash and recycling carts are overfilled or if materials are left outside of the container. *Waste must be contained at all times. Cart lids must close completely.*

- Do NOT empty the bear shed on service day or leave any additional materials outside of the container(s).
- Yard waste is considered trash outside of designated program dates and should be disposed of accordingly.
- The goal of this program is to prevent litter and reduce wildlife encounters by keeping solid waste contained.

Customers may face cleanup charges for overfilled containers.

Additional fines may be imposed by IVGID per Ordinance One.

Some options to reduce trash at the curb:

- Increase your cart size.
- Breakdown recyclables before placing in cart.
- Free transfer station drop off of recyclables.
- Drop off extra trash at the transfer station for a fee.
- 4 annual transfer station dumps at no additional cost for single-family property accounts.



CART PLACEMENT

- Trash and Recycling are collected weekly.
- Place carts at curb with handles facing away from the street.
- Do NOT overfill your carts or leave materials anywhere on the ground.
- Set carts 3 feet apart and away from objects such as cars and mailboxes.
- Place carts at the curb no earlier than 5 a.m. and no later than 7 a.m. on your service day only.

Aerosols: The IVGID HHW & E-Waste Program accepts aerosol cans. Empty canisters can go into your recycling cart. Schedule a drop-off appointment for aerosol cans still under pressure at ivgidhww.com

Antifreeze: Free drop-off recycling available at the Incline Village Transfer Station. Phone: (775) 831-2971

Appliances (Large): Major appliances (washers, dryers, ovens, freezers and refrigerators) can be taken to the Incline Village Transfer Station. Fees apply or include with bulky item drop-off. Phone: (775) 831-2971

Appliances (Small): Countertop appliances (excluding refrigerators) with an electric cord or circuit board can be recycled at the IVGID HHW & E-Waste Program. Schedule a drop-off appointment at ivgidhww.com

Batteries: Household batteries can be recycled at IVGID HHW & E-Waste Program. Battery recycling bins are available at IVGID Public Works, the Recreation Center and Village Ace Hardware Store. See next line for car battery recycling.

Car Batteries: Recycle old car and motorcycle batteries with purchase of a replacement. Drop off recycling is available at the Incline Village Transfer Station. Fees apply. Phone: (775) 831-2971

BRITA® Water Filters: All BRITA® brand products can be recycled through their website: brita.com

Building Materials (reusable): Truckee Meadows Habitat for Humanity's "ReStore" of Reno accepts everything from lumber to lighting fixtures. Useable windows, flooring, roofing material, sheetrock, fencing and usable paint can all be donated for reuse in a Habitat for Humanity house or for resale in their store.

Carpet: Gone Green Recycling in Sparks, NV offers drop-off and commercial recycling for carpet and pad. Fees apply. Call (775) 525-1447 for more information.

Cardboard: Flatten or break down and place in recycle cart. Large amounts or customers without recycling options at home can bring cardboard to the Incline Village Transfer Station. Clean and dry cardboard only.

No waxed, stained or greasy (pizza) boxes.

Cell Phones, GPS Devices, Routers and Tablets: Communication devices can be recycled at the IVGID HHW and E-Waste Program. Schedule a drop-off appointment at ivgidhww.com

Christmas Trees: Free, seasonal drop off and limited curbside collection occurs after the holiday. Visit inclinevillage.wm.com for announcements and program dates. Phone: (775) 831-2971

Christmas Lights: Check for retailer recycling options. Otherwise, these go in the trash.

Clothing: Local thrift stores accept gently used clothing. Online textile recyclers may be able to accept unwanted or unusable garments for recycling into new products. Example: bluejeansgogreen.org

Clothing Dryers and Washers: Major appliances (washers, dryers, ovens, freezers and refrigerators) can be taken to the Incline Village Transfer Station. Fees apply or include with bulky item drop off. Phone: (775) 831-2971

Construction Debris / Hardscape: See "Building Materials" for recycling options. Construction debris and related materials are accepted as landfill waste at the Incline Village Transfer Station. Fees apply or include with bulky item drop off. Visit inclinevillage.wm.com for details. Phone: (775) 831-2971

Computers: Computers and accessories can be recycled at the IVGID HHW and E-Waste Program.

NO TVs OR CRT MONITORS. Please see “TVs and CRT Monitors” for options.

Schedule a drop-off appointment for computer related e-waste at ivgidhww.com

Coat Hangers: Local dry cleaners may be able to take them. Plastic hangars can go in the trash.

Corks: Natural wine corks are recycled at Trader Joes, Whole Foods and Total Wine & More in Reno.

Dishwashers: Major appliances (washers, dryers, ovens, freezers and refrigerators) can be taken to the Incline Village Transfer Station. Fees apply or include with bulky item drop-off. Phone: (775) 831-2971

Eyeglasses: Most local opticians and Lenscrafters® locations provide recycle / reuse programs at their offices.

Electronics: Phones, radios, printers, computers, laptops, tablets, stereo equipment, fax machines and most household items with an electric cord or a circuit board can be recycled with the IVGID HHW and E-Waste Program. **NO TVs OR CRT MONITORS.** Please see “TVs and CRT Monitors” for options. Schedule a drop-off appointment at ivgidhww.com

Food: Contact Project MANA for donation of non-perishable food. Phone: (775) 298-0103

Fluorescent Light Bulbs (Tubes and Compact Fluorescents): These contain mercury; *do not throw in the regular trash.* Incandescent, halogen and LED lightbulbs can be thrown away in the trash. Fluorescent light bulbs from homes can be recycled for free at IVGID HHW and E-Waste Program. Some retailers can recycle fluorescent bulbs. Waste Management offers a mail-in program at a fee for recycling fluorescent bulbs available at thinkgreenfromhome.com

Furniture: Thrift stores accept many used items for resale, some have free pickup services. Furniture items can be taken to the Incline Village Transfer Station. Fees apply or include with bulky item drop-off. Phone: (775) 831-2971

Grocery Bags: Clean plastic grocery bags can be recycled in the box at the east entrance to the Incline Village Raley's.

Grease: Cooking grease clogs the sewer which can require expensive maintenance. Never place grease in the sink or toilet. Instead, use an old plastic or metal container with a lid and heat resistant turkey bag. Grease that solidifies after cooling off can be thrown in the trash. Liquid grease can be disposed of at the IVGID HHW and E-Waste Program. Schedule a drop-off appointment at ivgidhww.com

Green Waste: Tree Limbs, Stumps: On-site, free chipping is offered seasonally by appointment with the North Lake Tahoe Fire Protection District. Contact: (775) 831-0351 or visit nltfpd.org/curbside-chipping

Green Waste: Pine Needles: Seasonal curbside collection program offered annually. For current green waste recycling options and updated information, contact Waste Management at (775) 831-2971 or visit inclinevillage.wm.com

Household Hazardous Waste: Household hazardous materials include paint products, pesticides, fertilizers, disinfectants, acids, fire extinguishers, spa chemicals, etc... Incline Village and Crystal Bay Residents only. Appointments Only. Please visit ivgidhww.com to review accepted items and schedule a drop-off appointment. IVGID's HHW and E-Waste program is operated by IVGID Public Works at 1220 Sweetwater Rd. in Incline Village, NV. Phone: (775) 832-1284

Inkjet Cartridges: Contact manufacturer's and/or retailer's recycling program. Some manufacturers such as Xerox and HP provide free shipping boxes and labels to return used ink cartridges directly to their factories.

Junk Mail: Recycle in your cart. Remove plastic wrappers. Register with the Direct Marketing Association's (DMA) consumer website: DMAchoice.org for a processing fee to enable you to decide what mail you do and do not want through a simple, step-by-step process.

Medical Waste: Syringes: Pre-paid mail-in SHARPS containers can be obtained from the Incline Village Transfer Station during customer service hours. Phone: (775) 831-2971

Medicine/ Prescriptions or over the counter: *Never dispose of old medicine in the toilet!*

Drop-off containers are located inside the Incline Sheriff Substation at 625 Mount Rose Highway and at the Village Pharmacy located at 898 Tanager Street in Incline Village, NV.

Milk/Juice Square Cartons: *Combination paper / plastic cartons are not recyclable.* Place in trash or visit [terracycle.com](https://www.terracycle.com)

Microwaves: Microwaves and countertop toaster ovens can be recycled at the IVGID HHW and E-Waste Program. Schedule a drop-off appointment at [ivgidhhw.com](https://www.ivgidhhw.com)

Motor Oil and Filters: Free, drop-off recycling available at the Incline Village Transfer Station. Phone: (775) 831-2971.

Multimedia: Local schools and libraries are the perfect recipients for used CDs and DVDs in good shape. Check [greendisk.com](https://www.greendisk.com) for additional options at a fee. If the media is beyond re-use, it goes in the trash.

Ovens: Major appliances (washers, dryers, ovens, freezers and refrigerators) can be taken to the Incline Village Transfer Station. Fees apply or include with bulky item drop-off. Phone: (775) 831-2971

Packing Materials (plastic) peanuts, bubble wrap, air pouches: Most pack-and-ship stores will accept clean, used packing materials for reuse as storage area allows. Deflated film-plastic air pouches can be recycled with grocery bags.

Phone Books: Recycle in your cart, but better yet, request to *opt-out* of delivery by calling: Tahoe Telephone Directories - California, Nevada; (775) 586-8696

Pine Needles: See "Green Waste."

Plant Containers: Check with local nurseries on reuse programs or clean and place in your recycling cart.

Refrigerators and Freezers: Major appliances (washers, dryers, ovens, freezers and refrigerators) can be taken to the Incline Village Transfer Station. Fees apply or include with bulky item drop-off. Phone: (775) 831-2971

Shoes: Many thrift stores accept shoes that are in good shape. Nike's "Reuse-A-Shoe Program" recycling drop-off (any athletic shoe) is available in the Nike Factory Outlet at The Outlets at Legends, Sparks, NV. Phone: (775) 358-7871

Shipping Pallets: F.W. Carson accepts them for a fee. 1064 Tahoe Blvd., Incline Village, NV. Phone: (775) 831-5008

Skis & Snowboards: Local manufacturers can turn your old gear into chairs and décor: [forestfurnituretahoe.com](https://www.forestfurnituretahoe.com)

Styrofoam: *Styrofoam is NOT accepted in the curbside recycling program.* ACH Foam Technologies in Reno accepts drop-off. They take all white Styrofoam, including peanuts. Phone: (775) 343-3400.

Televisions: **TVs and CRT Monitors are NOT accepted at IVGID's HHW and E-Waste Program.** Many retailers recycle old TVs with the purchase of a new one, check store for details. Other options *at a fee* are located in Sparks, NV:

Toys: Dolls, stuffed animals and other childhood favorites are always in demand, however new regulations restrict their resale at thrift stores. Plastic toys can be placed in the recycling.

Tires: Tires can be disposed of for a fee, but are *not recycled* at the Incline Village Transfer Station. Most retailers can recycle old tires for a fee or with purchase of a new set.

Yoga Mats: Designate your old mat as an "outdoor" mat, cut into small circles and place under furniture legs or use as jar openers, use as a kneeling mat for gardening and house projects or place in the trunk of your car to collect dirt.

Recycling: Frequently Asked Questions

DO I NEED TO SORT EVERYTHING?

There is NO need to sort; keep recyclables and trash separate.

Recycling MUST be CLEAN.

Remove all liquids, rinse food containers and flatten or break down bulky items.
All recyclable items, including cardboard, can be mixed inside the designated container.

HOW MUCH CAN I RECYCLE?

All trash and recycling must fit inside standard containers. If you have excess recycling, consider dropping it off for free at the Incline Village Transfer Station at 1200 Sweetwater Road or upgrading your capacity for ongoing needs.

WHY SHOULD I RECYCLE?

The service rate set by Waste Management for single-family residential properties includes trash and recycling services even if you elect not to participate in the recycling program.

Service rates for multi-family residential and commercial properties are based on volume. On-site recycling service is cheaper than on-site trash service.

Recycling gives you extra waste capacity on-site at your property, will save you money in comparison to disposing all materials as trash and conserves our community's resources by minimizing landfilled waste.

WHEN WILL MY RECYCLING BE PICKED UP?

Residential recycling is scheduled for pick-up every week, on the same day as your trash service.
Call Waste Management at (775) 831-2971 or visit inclinevillage.wm.com for your service route schedule.

CUSTOMERS SERVICED BY CURBSIDE COLLECTION

Recycle using the provided cart – place curbside on your service day, collected every week.

Bear Shed (bear box) users – keep your cart for weekly curbside collection or designate a can(s) inside the Bear Shed for recycling by applying a recycle-vector (symbol) sticker and notify Waste Management by calling (775) 831-2971.

CUSTOMERS SERVICED BY DUMPSTERS

Look for the designated recycling cart(s) or dumpster(s) or bring your recyclables to the Incline Village Transfer Station.

HOW DO I RECYCLE IF I LIVE IN A CONDO COMPLEX OR WORK AT A SMALL BUSINESS?

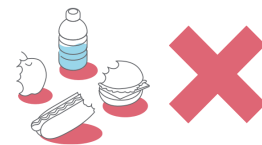
Designated recycling carts and dumpsters are available for use at multi-family residential and commercial properties.
