Dear Mr. Martin;

This letter requests your review of the proposed 666-acre Skyline Landfill Dallas and Ellis Counties, Texas pursuant to the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966. The project is subject to compliance with Section 404 of the Clean Water Act. The proposed facility is located near the community of Ferris south of Ten Mile Creek which is a tributary to the Trinity River. According to the Texas Historical Commission's Archeological Sites Atlas, there four previously-recorded historic-age archeological sites located within boundaries of the proposed landfill (41EL219, 41DL359, 41DL360, and 41DL361). All four of these sites were reported in a 1994 archeological survey report by Michael W. Davis, James T. Jones and Abbey Treece, entitled *An Intensive Cultural Resources Survey and Assessment to Support Federal Permitting of the Proposed Expansion of the Skyline Landfill, Dallas and Ellis Counties*, which covered approximately 490 acres of the current project. The Atlas does not include site forms or other detailed information on these sites. Moreover, since the survey was conducted prior to the Texas Historical Commission's survey standards, the survey methods are not known.

Ferris, Texas was the site of several brick manufacturers before World War I. An examination of the USGS Ferris, 7.5 min. Series Quadrangle map (attached) shows numerous clay pits and buildings within the proposed project area, presumably related to brick manufacture; however, no previously recorded historic structures exist within the project boundaries.

Please provide cultural resources clearance or recommendations for further consultation, if necessary.


